



Philip Gallaway **Principal Second Violin**

Principal second violinist of sinfonia VIVA since January 2002, Philip Gallaway has enjoyed a wide-ranging career as a chamber musician, soloist, orchestral player, and teacher.

Born and educated in Norfolk, Philip subsequently studied at the Royal Academy of Music. His teachers have included Frederick Grinke, Clarence Myerscough, Sidney Griller, and members of the Amadeus Quartet.

As a founder member of the Coull Quartet, which recently celebrated thirty years as Quartet-in-Residence at the University of Warwick, he has performed and broadcast in over 20 countries, including Australia, India, the Far East and the USA. The Quartet's many highly acclaimed recordings include the complete Mendelssohn and Schubert quartets and several 20th century British works.

He has played with many orchestras, including the CBSO, the London Mozart Players and Kent Opera and is currently leader of Midlands-based Orchestra da Camera, with whom he has appeared as soloist.

In 1992 he received an honorary ARAM.
